May occasionally roost in bat boxes and tree holes. A migrant bat, the longest move recorded is 1440 km. Feeds on small insects caught on the wing. Females give birth to two young in June-July.

<u>Range</u> –Occurs in northern Europe (northern limit at 65° N), central and south-eastern Europe, it is absent from Great Britain, and the Iberian Peninsula; also present in Asia east to Manchuria and, south, to Iran, Afghanistan and northern Pakistan.

In Italy it is confined to the north-east.
